Early History of Aston on Trent

Aston on Trent is a rural village approximately seven miles to the south-west of Derby City. It has around 1800 residents. Aston on Trent was mentioned in the Domesday book, is near the site of a Neolithic settlement and has a wealth of social and working heritage. Until the early twentieth century much of the village and adjoining land was owned by wealthy families, including the Holden and Boden families.

Timeline during the World Wars

August 1914: A meeting was held by Rev James Holden to encourage villagers from Aston and Weston to volunteer to fight in WWI (The Great War).

January 1915: Men from Aston and Weston volunteered to form part of the Home Guard – known as "Dad's Army".

During WWI, Aston Hall was used as a hospital to treat wounded soldiers.

Throughout WWII, Aston was used as a 'decoy sight' during bombing raids to protect Rolls Royce in Derby.

Those who gave their lives in the First and Second World Wars are commemorated in the form of Aston's War Memorial Hall.

Edith Greatorex	Her husband fought with the Royal Navy in WWI. She wrote letters and poems to commemorate the fallen.
Major Guy Winterbottom	Served during WWI and was killed in action in 1917. There is a window in church dedicated to his









memory.
