Key vocabulary

Discrimination	The unjust or prejudicial treatment of different categories of people, especially on the grounds of race, age, sex or disability.
Excluded	To feel that you are not part of a the main group.
Consequences	A result or effect, typically one that is unwelcome or unpleasant
Disputes	A disagreement or argument
Hurtful Behaviour	Actions which cause pain or harm to others (emotional or physical).
Resolve	Settle or find a resolution to a problem.
Conflict	A strong disagreement or bad feeling between people.
Emotions	Strong feelings as a reaction to what happens around us.
