Stereotyping	Assuming someone will behave in a certain way because of a certain characteristic. This could be based on the way they look, the way they speak, where they come from or their gender.

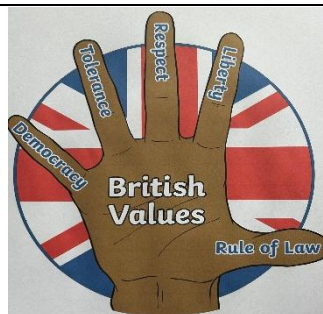
Being Me
