

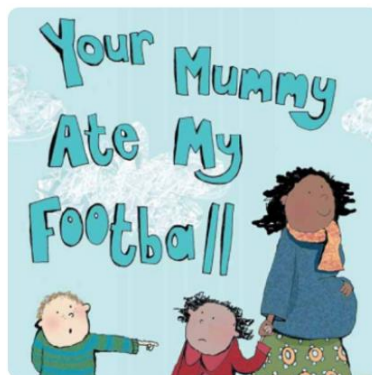
Curriculum overview

We will learn how a baby is made inside a Mummy's tummy and how it is born. That babies need lots of care and love. That there are physical changes from child to adult bodies. Physical contact should be agreed by both and no one has a right to touch them in a way that makes them feel uncomfortable. That physical hygiene is important especially as our body grows and changes.

Key vocabulary

Pregnant	When a woman has a baby growing inside her.
womb	A special place inside a woman's body where the baby grows.
Umbilical chord	A little tube through which the unborn baby is fed.
Sperm	A special seed inside a male body.
Ovary	A female body part where the eggs are kept.
Breasts	Parts of the female body that have breastmilk in them.
breastfeeding	When a mum holds a baby close and feeds it breast milk
Vagina	A stretchy hole in between the female's legs, that the baby comes out of.

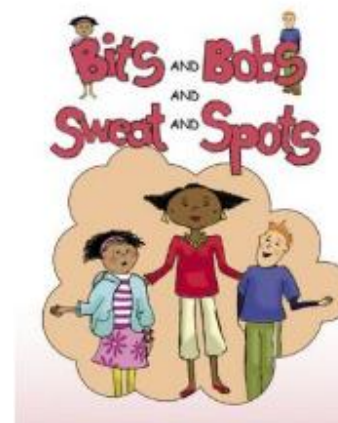
Our topic is... Growing Up
