Money	Something people use to pay for things they need.
Employment	Having a job.
Wages	The amount of money people get paid for doing their job.
Bank account	A place to store money safely.
Debit card	A small plastic card which is linked to a bank account. People can use a debit card to pay money from their bank
	account.
Credit card	A card which enables people to spend money that has been lent by a credit company. People can spend more
	money than they have and then repay it later. People pay interest for borrowing this money.
Contactless payment	Paying for goods and services by tapping a debit card onto a small machine. This transfers money from the
	linked bank account to the business you want to pay.
Online payment	Paying for goods and services on the Internet by entering the details from a debit card in a form. This transfers
	money from a person's bank account to the business they want to pay.
Interest	A fee charged for borrowing money.

Gambling	Playing games of chance to win money – like a bet.
Priority	Things we consider most important.
Entrepreneur	A person who sets up a business, taking on financial risk to make a profit.
