

Curriculum overview

We will learn about how to stay safe when playing outside. The possible hazards children may come across when they are outside. That first aid is important but there are times when we may need to contact emergency services. How to seek help from trusted adults when they need it.

Key vocabulary

Hazard	Something that could cause harm or danger.
Risk	A possibility of danger or harm.
First Aid	The first help given straight away to someone who is ill or injured.
Emergency	A serious and often dangerous situation. People in emergency situations need help straight away.
Danger	Something which can cause harm injury or suffering.
Responsibility	The control we have over our actions and choices.
Safety	Being protected or kept safe from danger, risk or harm.
Wellbeing	How comfortable, happy and healthy we feel and how able we are to cope with daily life.

Sticky knowledge

Pupils know that...

- When playing outside, open water, lakes, rivers and canals, railways and roads are hazards.
- When playing outside there are risks such as bites and stings.
- If you need help in an emergency you can phone 999 for Ambulance, Police or Fire service.
- The Fire service also rescues people from rivers and if they are trapped somewhere.
- If an adult won't listen when they need to tell something important they should keep trying or tell another adult.

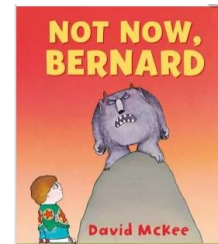
